The **Arts in the Community Grants Program (ACG)** replaces the programs known as Decentralization (DEC) and Statewide Community Re-grants (SCR) with the addition of new opportunities and levels of funding for not-for-profit organizations, municipalities, Tribal Nations, and individual artists or artist collectives for projects taking place in 2024 and into early 2025.

BACK BY POPULAR DEMAND and touting a newly released CD "Antique Pieces", its our hometown prodigy Matt Nakoa! As stated by Matt, "Long before I ever sang songs, I wrote piano music. *Antique Dances* is a special selection of original works that I dusted off and polished up during my COVID lockdown retreat. They have an old-world sound and are based on old-world dance forms. Sometimes, when modern life feels too fast and loud, it's good to escape to distant times and places."

Growing up on a small goat farm in rural Smyrna, NY, Matt discovered music as a means of teenage escape and trained to be a concert pianist. Matt was ultimately accepted as a vocalist to Berklee College of Music where he studied alongside soon-to-be Grammy winners St. Vincent and Esperanza Spalding among others. After school, Matt landed in NYC's vibrant piano bar scene. There he quickly became a star performer at Manhattan's famous Brandy's Piano Bar, with lines waiting outside the door each Saturday night.

As if illustrating two sides of himself, Matt's first album, *Light In The Dark* (2012), is a sweeping pop opus, while *A Dozen Other Loves* (2014) explores an intimate acoustic palette. Across the board Matt's song craft has garnered awards, including a win at Kerrville Folk Festival's prestigious New Folk Competition.

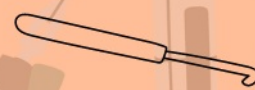

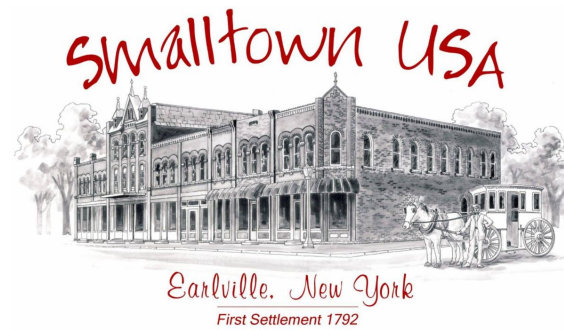

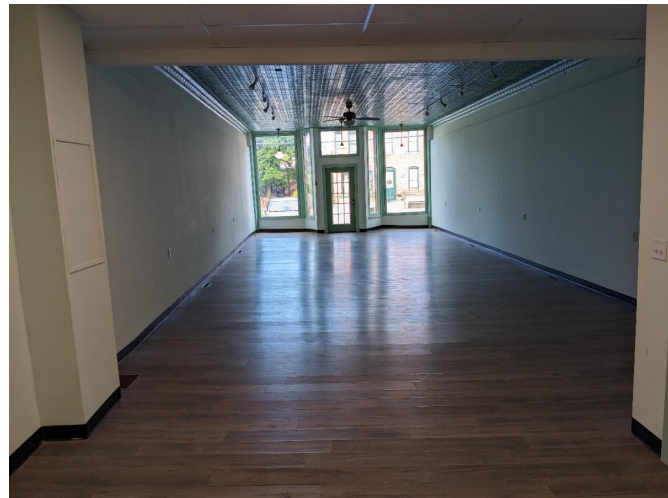
