
The Earlville Opera House will be closed from Saturday, December 21 at 4pm until Tuesday, January 7, 2020 at 10am.

#### Registration Open For CFSCNY 2020 Winter Grant Writing Technical Assistance Workshops!

The Community Foundation for South Central New York offers FREE grant writing technical assistance workshops twice a year to organizations that would like to be oriented to our grant-making process. Over the winter we will offer workshops in Broome, Tioga, Chenango, Delaware and Otsego counties. At the session we review the 2020 funding opportunities offered by the foundation, cover tips on how to write a successful proposal, and explain how applications are reviewed and recommended for funding. The workshops are not mandatory for applicants but are recommended to organizations that are new to our process or haven't submitted an application recently.
