# BROOME, CHENANGO & OTSEGO COUNTY DECENTRALIZATION (DEC) GRANT PROGRAM

### PURPOSE AND HISTORY OF THE DEC PROGRAM:

The New York State Council on the Arts (NYSCA) is dedicated to preserving and expanding the rich and diverse cultural resources that are and will become the heritage of New York's citizens. In 1977, NYSCA developed the Decentralization program to ensure New York State's cultural funding reached every part of the State. This program is funded in all 62 counties, and funds are regranted at a local level. Through this program, not-for-profit organizations and individual artists may apply annually for grants up to \$5000 to help strengthen the arts and cultural programs in their communities. The goal is to make state arts support available to geographically, economically, and ethnically diverse segments of the state's population. The DEC Program has been administered in Chenango County since 1986 and Earlville Opera House began administering the DEC program in 2020.

#### FROM THE DEC DESK:

The EOH DEC application deadline for 2021 was Friday, January 15, 2021 and resulted in **39 applications**. This is a total amount of **\$163,803 in requests** for both **Community Arts and Arts Education grants** throughout the tri-county service area, arue testament to the extraordinary needs and pressures our artists and cultural organizations are experiencing, as well as their resilience during these Covid times.

The DEC grant panel will meet March 12. Please watch our website for updates.

### **Phil Leith-Tetrault**

Phil Leith-Tetrault's work explores the idea of beauty in desolation. Inspired by his childhood trips to Greenland, Newfoundland, and Northern Quebec, he emphasizes the pristine beauty of these environments as well as their loneliness and distance from the modern world. The landscapes suggest places free of society's grip, places without boundaries or rules. There, beauty and desolation are inseparable and reinforce one another.



He makes these landscape prints using illustration software. He draws organic shapes in the form of old houses, mountains, trees, rocks, and flowers before filling them with vivid color and photographed textures. During this process, the landscape begins to suggest physical and emotional feelings associated with its location.
