




Tumbleweed Gumbo March 13 @ 1PM

<u>**Guaranteed Income for Artists (GI):**</u> Will support 2,400 New York State artists with regular, \$1,000, no-strings-attached cash payments for 18 consecutive months.

Artist Employment Program (AEP): Will fund employment for 300 artists working in collaboration with community-based organizations across the State for 2 years. Participating AEP artists will receive a salary of \$65,000 per year plus benefits and dedicated time to focus on their artistic practice.

Note that non-arts community-based organizations (e.g., social service, education, justice, and environmental organizations), arts organizations, and government entities are all welcome to apply to employ individual artists for CRNY's Artist Employment Program.

Applications for both programs launched February 14 and the deadline to apply is March 25 at 11:59 PM Eastern.
