What's the difference between a fiddle and a violin? Grammy®-Awarded and Emmy-nominated, Eileen Ivers, continues to push the fiddling tradition boundaries from a folk music staple to a fiercely fresh, powerfully beautiful, intensely driving world stage experience. Eileen has performed with Sting, 'Fiddlers 3' with Nadja Salerno-Sonnenberg and Regina Carter, Patti Smith, Al Di Meola, The Chieftains, was the groundbreaking Musical Star of Riverdance, a founding member of Cherish the Ladies, a former member of the Hall & Oates band, a featured instrumentalist on soundtracks including "Gangs of New York" and Back to Titanic", and she is one of the most awarded All-Ireland Fiddle and Banjo champions ever. Eileen has been proclaimed "a national treasure" by NCTA Board Chairman George Holt as she celebrates her 30 plus year career as a performer, composer, producer, songwriter, band leader, educator, multi-instrumentalist and renowned pioneer in connecting her American, Irish traditional, jazz, blues, and world roots.

BROOME, CHENANGO & OTSEGO COUNTY STATE COMMUNITY REGRANT (SCR) PROGRAM (Formerly Decentralization)

PURPOSE AND HISTORY OF THE SCR PROGRAM:

The New York State Council on the Arts (NYSCA) is dedicated to preserving and expanding the rich and diverse cultural resources that are and will become the heritage of New York's citizens. In 1977, NYSCA developed the former Decentralization (DEC) Program, now called the State Community Regrant (SCR) Program, to ensure New York State's cultural funding reached every part of the State. This program is funded in all 62 counties, and funds are regranted at a local level. Through this program, not-for-profit

organizations and artists may apply annually for grants up to \$5000 to help strengthen the arts and cultural programs in their communities. The goal is to make state arts support available to geographically, economically, and ethnically diverse segments of the state's population. The SCR Program has been administered in Chenango County since 1986 and Earlville Opera House began administering the SCR program in 2020 at the invitation of NYSCA. Eligibility: Artists, not-for-profit organizations, and municipalities in Broome, Chenango, and Otsego County.

Restart NY Regrants are offered as part of the New York State Council on the Arts' Recovery Fund Initiative and are designed to support live performance projects as well as projects that feature a public program or presentation.

Amount and project dates: Grant awards of up to \$5000 will be awarded for inperson performances and events occurring between July 1, 2021 and June 30, 2022.

Application deadline: September 30, 2021

The Statewide Community Regrants Program (SCR)

GUIDELINES AND APPLICATION COMING SOON!

Eligibility: Artists, not-for-profit organizations, and municipalities in Broome, Chenango, and Otsego County.

SCR (formerly Decentralization or DEC) provides funding for community-based arts programming and arts education.

Amount and project dates: Grant awards of up to \$5000 will be awarded for projects occurring between January 1, 2022 and December 31, 2022.

Application deadline: January 19, 2022
